



Solidago albopilosa



WHITE-HAIRED GOLDENROD

RANGE: Red River Gorge Geological Area in Kentucky,

HISTORY: Declared a federally threatened species, this unique plant is found no where else on earth.

HABITAT: Rockshelters and on rock ledges. Grows individually and in large patches.

DESCRIPTION: Long, soft, white hairs cover leaves and stems. Flowers are fragrant and bright yellow. Blooms September through November.

THREATS: Walking and camping in rockshelters and digging for artifacts damages the plants and compacts the soil.

TO HELP:

1. Avoid trampling the plant.
2. Protect its habitat - don't camp or build fires in rockshelters.
3. Report looters digging for artifacts.
